<a href="#">CRC Probation and Dismissal Process</a>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Currently, Probation I is identified as a student who has enrolled in 12 units, is currently registered/enrolled, with a GPA below 2.0 or completed less than half of the coursework.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The District Office mandates the 12 units.</li> <li>○ Unfortunately, a student can enroll in 6 units and fail all 6 units and not be placed on probation.</li> <li>○ The Workgroup agrees to establish new parameter of 6 units to support early effort to success.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Best success is seen with earlier intervention.</li> <li>• We estimate ~1,600 students/semester are placed on probation.</li> <li>• We estimate ~100 multiple dismissals per academic year.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Students can have a unit cap established (e.g., a cap of 6 units or 2 courses). However, this does not prevent the students from going to another college.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The CRC Probation and Dismissal Process continues to be defined.</li> </ul>	Oscar	Next meeting
Early Alert	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BIRT (Behavior Intervention Response Team) is not an early alert system               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Students are referred to BIRT</li> <li>○ BIRT is set up to help students who have non-academic issues (e.g., behavior outside of student conduct, food insecurity, showers, etc.)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		Next meeting

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We need to re-brand “Early Alert” <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>“Alert” can be perceived as negative.</li> <li>Come up with a positive name</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	All	
Pilot Campaign	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Utilize the tools we currently have available to establish an early alert system</li> <li>Recruit faculty (already using Canvas) to generate an attendance report from their classes (from Canvas). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We realize that attendance is only one factor that may show a student may need support.</li> <li>For this pilot, we want to focus on one variable.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The attendance report will go to Staying on the Path (for now)/Student Services.</li> <li>Student Services will personally contact students to provide assistance.</li> <li>The group needs to develop a script for the initial contact.</li> <li>Redesign the job description for our SPA, Peer Mentor, and/or other positions to see how we can incorporate some of these ‘high touches’ to help students to stay on their path.</li> <li>How can Canvas be used more effectively as a communication, monitoring, &amp; early alert tool? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SCC and ARC are currently developing this tool with Canvas.
